More law enforcement officers and firefighters have died by suicide as compared to other line-of-duty related deaths. Worse, it's believed that the number of public safety personnel who take their own lives is underreported, making the actual numbers even higher.

By the Numbers

of first responders develop depression, PTSD, and other behavioral health conditions

vs. 0.5% of fire and EMS personnel have attempted suicide compared to civilians

the rate of first responders who contemplate suicide vs. the average American adult

Suicide prevention resources may be better received if they're delivered by a fellow first responder or someone well trained in first responder culture and experience.
